



ELECTORAL VIOLENCE IN NEBAJ, GUATEMALA.

December 2013.

The Permanent Secretariat of Latin American and Caribbean Network for Democracy (REDLAD) supports the decision of the Supreme Electoral Tribunal (TSE) of Guatemala , to repeat the election of the mayor and the municipal corporation in Santa María de Nebaj, a town in El Quiché in the northwest of the country near the border with Mexico .

Through Decree 1-2013, TSE requested repetition of the elections because in September 2011, was not included former Mayor Virgilio Guzman Bernal, on the ballot. During the election, the winner was Pedro Cobo Raymundo, who currently holds that position.

Decree, including the holding of elections on 15 December and argues that only participate in candidates until June 11, 2011, ie , those who legitimately was nominated as candidates . However, following the announcement, the climate of violence has been unleashed on the site and a few days ago Odilio Jesús López González, president of the Departmental Electoral Board of the Supreme Electoral Tribunal (TSE) of Quiche, was murdered violently.

The president of the TSE , Maria Eugenia Villagran, had asked for more than three weeks ago protection for Odilio López. Now , the Court urges the state to provide security protections for members of the Electoral Board and also ensure the development of peaceful elections and control any cluster of violence and intimidation.
